Van Leeuwen, Jean. *Across the wide dark sea : the Mayflower journey*.

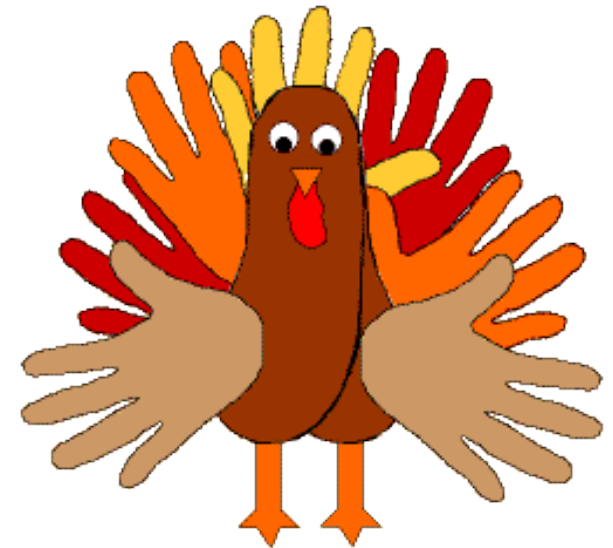
