Where are these books?

All Fiction books are shelved on the Newberry Awards shelves, under the authors' names. Non-fiction books are shelved by Dewey Decimal number. "J" is on the Lower Floor, otherwise the books are upstairs.

What is the Newbery Medal?



The Newbery Award was the first children's book award in the world.

The Newbery Medal was named for eighteenth-century British bookseller John Newbery. It is awarded annually by the Association for Library Service to Children, a division of the American Library Association, to the author of the most distinguished contribution to American literature for children.

From the beginning of the awarding of the Newbery and Caldecott Medals, committees could, and usually did, cite other books as worthy of attention. Such books were referred to as Newbery or Caldecott "runners-up." In 1971 the term "runners-up" was changed to "honor books." The new terminology was made retroactive so that all former runners-up are now referred to as Newbery or Caldecott Honor Books. The Longview Public Library Newbery collection ONLY includes Newbery Award Fiction.
